- Leading in legislative advocacy for youth financial education, resulting in an amendment to the Florida Education Standards that includes training and testing on financial education concepts prior to graduation
- Convening six statewide conferences with national and international speakers on topics related to asset building and financial education
- Convening a Transportation Solutions Forum for Florida to result in the creation of a transportation continuum of services for LMI families
- Partnering with statewide organizations such as the Florida Council for Economic Education, the Florida Bankers' Association, the League of Southeast Credit Unions, United Ways' ALICE Initiative, RAISE Florida Network, the Florida Association of CDCs, and the Children's Movement, among others, to increase collaboration among entities and increase awareness
- Partnering with national organizations such as the Corporation for Enterprise Development, National Disability Institute, and Opportunity Nation to bring national best practices and innovative programs into Florida communities

The FPP is the unifying entity among the many and varied non-profit organizations that provide services for LMI Floridians.

Here are just a few examples of FPP by the numbers:
