

**CITY OF LAUDERHILL
DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY
(SOE 20-20 Sixteenth 7-Day Extension)**

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020 at 5:52 p.m., Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-52 activating the Florida Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and declaring that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners issued a Declaration of Emergency declaring Broward County under a Local State of Emergency on March 10, 2020 at 12:25 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2020 at 11:30 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared a State of Emergency as to the Public Health Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-01); and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020 at 2:40 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared an actual State of Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-02), based upon the Governor's Executive Order Number 20-52; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8½ - 3(c), declarations of a state of emergency shall be for a period of time not to exceed seven (7) days at a time and may be extended for additional periods of time not to exceed seven (7) day increments; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 at 2:40 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the first seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-03) in the City of Lauderhill effective through March 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020 at 2:25 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the second seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-04) in the City of Lauderhill effective through March 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2020 at 12:30 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the third seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-06) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, at 1:05 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fourth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-07) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 14, at 10:16 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fifth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-09) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, at 8:45 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the sixth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-10) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, at 9:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the seventh seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-11) in the City of Lauderhill effective through May 5, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on May 5, at 9:25 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the eighth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-12) in the City of Lauderhill effective through May 12, 2020, which also announced some Phase 1 re-openings; and

WHEREAS on May 12, 2020 at 11:30 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the ninth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-13) in the City of Lauderhill effective through May 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2020, Broward County issued Emergency Order 20-10 (EO 20-10) authorizing certain re-openings within Broward County, which authorizes municipalities to impose stricter provisions; and

WHEREAS, on May 19, 2020, at 11:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the tenth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-14) in the City of Lauderhill effective through May 26, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2020, at 2:15 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the eleventh seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-15) in the City of Lauderhill effective through June 2, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2020, at 12:50 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the twelfth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency and a State of Emergency regarding Civil Unrest (SOE 20-16) in the City of Lauderhill effective through June 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2020, at 12:26 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirteenth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-17) in the City of Lauderhill effective through June 16, 2020; and


WHEREAS, on June 16, 2020, at 11:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fourteenth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-18) in the City of Lauderhill effective through June 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2020, at 8:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fifteenth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-19) in the City of Lauderhill effective through June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS this SOE 20-20 extends the Declaration of a State of Emergency for the sixteenth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency in the City of Lauderhill;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Desorae Giles-Smith, the Interim City Manager of the City of Lauderhill, effective at 4:18 a.m./p.m. on Tuesday, June 30, 2020, do hereby:

1. **Extension.** The declaration of a STATE OF EMERGENCY which exists in the City of Lauderhill is hereby extended for the sixteenth seven (7) day extension through July 7, 2020, unless otherwise terminated or extended.
2. **Mandatory Facial Coverings.** Facial coverings consistent with CDC Guidelines are mandatory and must be worn at all times by every person working, living, visiting, or doing business within the City of Lauderhill whenever a minimum of six (6) feet distance requirement cannot continuously be maintained between any persons who are not members of the same household. Facial coverings must also continue to be worn consistent with all Emergency Orders that remain in effect including, but not limited to, Broward County EO 20-10, 20-12, EO 20-13, EO 20-14, EO 20-15, and EO 20-17. Exceptions for those who are not required to wear facial coverings as provided in prior Broward County Emergency Orders continue to remain as valid exceptions.
