## CITY OF LAUDERHILL DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY (SOE 20-48 Forty-second COVID 7-Day Extension)

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020 at 5:52 p.m., Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-52 activating the Florida Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and declaring that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners issued a Declaration of Emergency declaring Broward County under a Local State of Emergency on March 10, 2020 at 12:25 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2020 at 11:30 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared a State of Emergency as to the Public Health Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-01); and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020 at 2:40 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared an actual State of Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-02), based upon the Governor's Executive Order Number 20-52; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8½ - 3(c), declarations of a state of emergency shall be for a period of time not to exceed seven (7) days at a time and may be extended for additional periods of time not to exceed seven (7) day increments; and

WHEREAS, thereafter the City of Lauderhill has continuously issued seven (7) day extensions of the Declaration of a State of Emergency regarding COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirty-fifth seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-41) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through November 17, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2020 at 9:30 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirty-sixth seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-42) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through November 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on November 24, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirty-seventh seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-43) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through December 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, at 3:42 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirty-eighth seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-44) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through December 8, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on December 8, at 2:30 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the thirty-ninth seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-45) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through December 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on December, 15 at 11:15 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fortieth seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-46) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through December 22, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on December, 22 at 2:03 p.m. the City of Lauderhill declared the forty-first seven (7) day extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 20-47) regarding COVID in the City of Lauderhill effective through December 29, 2020; and

WHEREAS, this SOE 20-48 extends the Declaration of a State of Emergency regarding COVID for the forty-second seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency in the City of Lauderhill; and

NOW, THEREFORE, Desorae Giles-Smith, the City Manager of the City of Lauderhill, effective at a.m./p.m. on Tuesday, December 29, 2020, do hereby extend the declaration of a

STATE OF EMERGENCY which exists in the City of Lauderhill for the forty-second seven (7) day extension through January 5, 2021, unless otherwise terminated or extended.
