CITY OF LAUDERHILL DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY (SOE 22-07 One Hundredth and First COVID 7-Day Extension)

WHEREAS, the State of Florida, County of Broward, and City of Lauderhill remain under a State of Emergency regarding COVID-19 since March 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020 the City of Lauderhill first declared a State of Emergency at 2:40 p.m. (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-02), based upon the Governor's Executive Order Number 20-52; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8½ - 3(c), declarations of a state of emergency shall be for a period of time not to exceed seven (7) days at a time and may be extended for additional periods of time not to exceed seven (7) day increments; and

WHEREAS, continuous weekly extensions have been entered every week thereafter through until current date; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2022 9:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the Ninety-Ninth weekly extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 22-05) regarding COVID-19 for the City of Lauderhill effective through February 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on February 8, 2022 10:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the One Hundredth weekly extension of the State of Emergency (SOE 22-06) regarding COVID-19 for the City of Lauderhill effective through February 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, this SOE 22-07 hereby continues to extend the State of Emergency regarding COVID-19 for the One Hundredth and First (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency in the City of Lauderhill; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Desorae Giles-Smith, the City Manager of the City of Lauderhill, effective at a.m./p.m. on Tuesday, February 15, 2022, do hereby extend the declaration of a STATE OF EMERGENCY which exists in the City of Lauderhill for the One Hundredth and First seven (7) day extension brough February 22, 2022, unless otherwise terminated or extended, as authorized by City Code Chapter 8½.
